## **Forsyth Mayor Eric Wilson Elected to MEAG Power Board**

**ATLANTA – July 25, 2022** – MEAG Power announced today that Forsyth, Ga., Mayor Eric S. Wilson has been elected to the MEAG Power Board, filling the vacancy resulting from retired Crisp County Power Commission General Manager Steve A. Rentfrow’s retirement from the Board after 27 years of service. Wilson has been mayor of Forsyth since 2016 and is president and CEO of MedPro EMS in Forsyth.

Three members of the MEAG Power Board are elected each year at the MEAG Power Annual Meeting, which took place July 20. Mayor Wilson was elected to a three-year term on the nine-member Board. Larry M. Vickery, Calhoun Utilities General Manager, and LaGrange Utility Director Patrick C. Bowie, Jr., were re-elected to new terms on the Board.

At the Board meeting in which Mayor Wilson was seated, the existing Board officers were re-elected: Mayor R. Steve “Thunder” Tumlin, Jr., Chairman; Larry M. Vickery, Vice Chairman; and L. Timothy Houston, Sr., Secretary-Treasurer.

“I welcome Mayor Wilson and look forward to working with the strong leaders on the MEAG Power Board,” said MEAG Power President & CEO Jim Fuller. “Our joint commitment to public power and serving the needs of the 49 Participant communities of MEAG Power are our guiding principles.”
