Andrew Busch is the former Chief Market Intelligence Officer for the U.S. government and economic futurist at AndrewBusch.com. For the Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC), he was charged with improving and enhancing the government's understanding of the markets and the economy. Dr. Pielke holds degrees in mathematics, public policy and political science, all from the University of Colorado Boulder. Among other awards and recognition, in 2006, he received the Eduard Brückner Prize in Munich for outstanding achievement in interdisciplinary climate research. The author of numerous books, his most recent is **The Rightful Place of Science: Disasters and Climate Change** (2nd edition, 2018, Consortium for Science, Policy & Outcomes).
